The Pediatric Physiotherapy and Wellness Center will provide specialised care for children, particularly those from leprosyaffected families and the general population, to address developmental delays, cerebral palsy, obesity, and other health challenges.

Rationale

The centre will ensure early identification and intervention and provide a holistic approach that supports physical, cognitive, and emotional development and prevents long-term disabilities among the growing paediatric population in Prayagraj.




Key Interventions

Services include early intervention, motor skill assessments, functional improvement programs, and innovative strategies to engage children and families in physiotherapy and occupational therapy.

Target Beneficiaries

The centre will support 15 to 20 children monthly, tailoring interventions to their unique needs and improving their quality of life, social engagement, and functional skills.







Expected outcome

By fostering preventive health, educating parents, and collaborating with local schools, this initiative promotes sustainable community health and may generate revenue for the hospital, reinforcing its commitment to societal welfare.







Project Overview

The Centre aims at empowering aspiring nurses through comprehensive training, emphasising compassionate patient care and leadership in the healthcare domain.

Rationale

Given the huge shortage of nurses with leprosy expertise, this centre will fill a critical gap by preparing future nurses to prevent impairments and disabilities among leprosy patients, improving healthcare quality.







Key Interventions

The curriculum provides specialised training in leprosy care, combining traditional and modern treatment approaches, hands-on clinical experience, and health education for patients and their families.



This initiative creates a pipeline of skilled leprosy care professionals, enhancing the quality of life of patients. Annual student admissions through government and management seats ensure long-term sustainability and community impact.











Expected outcome

Around 200 leprosy patients treated at TLM Naini, both inpatients and outpatients, will benefit from specialised nursing care, while families receive health education support.
